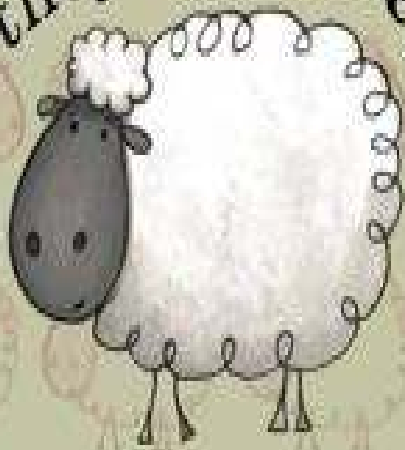
Up on a **hill**

They had cows...

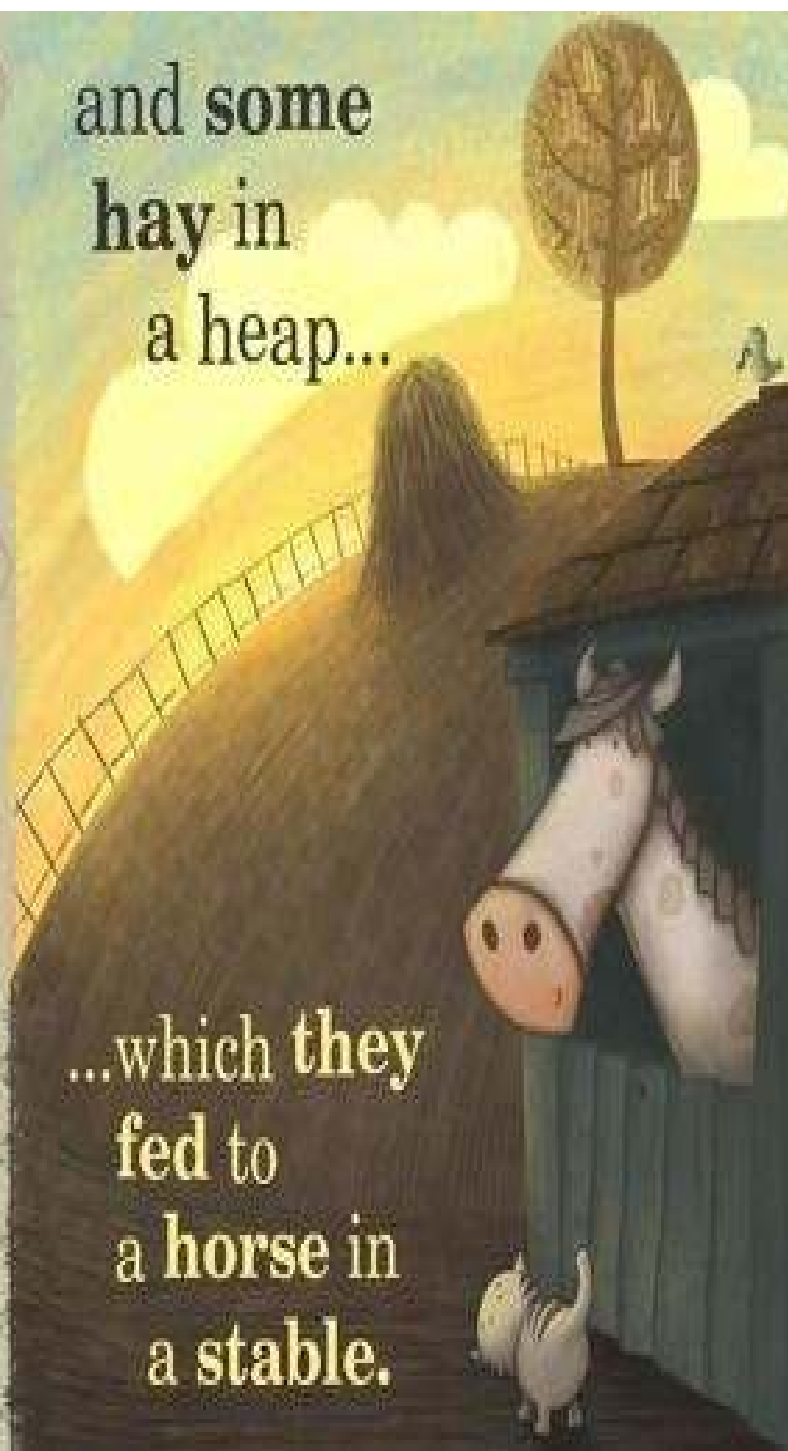


...they had sheep...



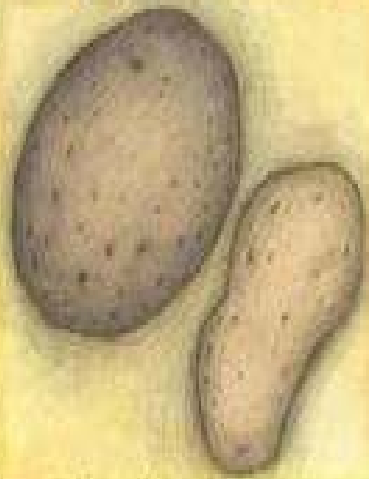
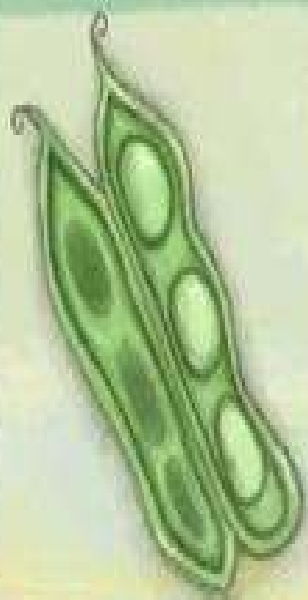
and some

a stable.

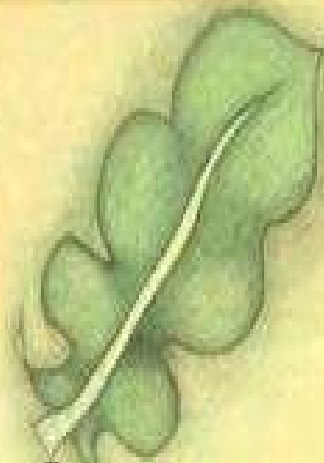




They had

stripey...

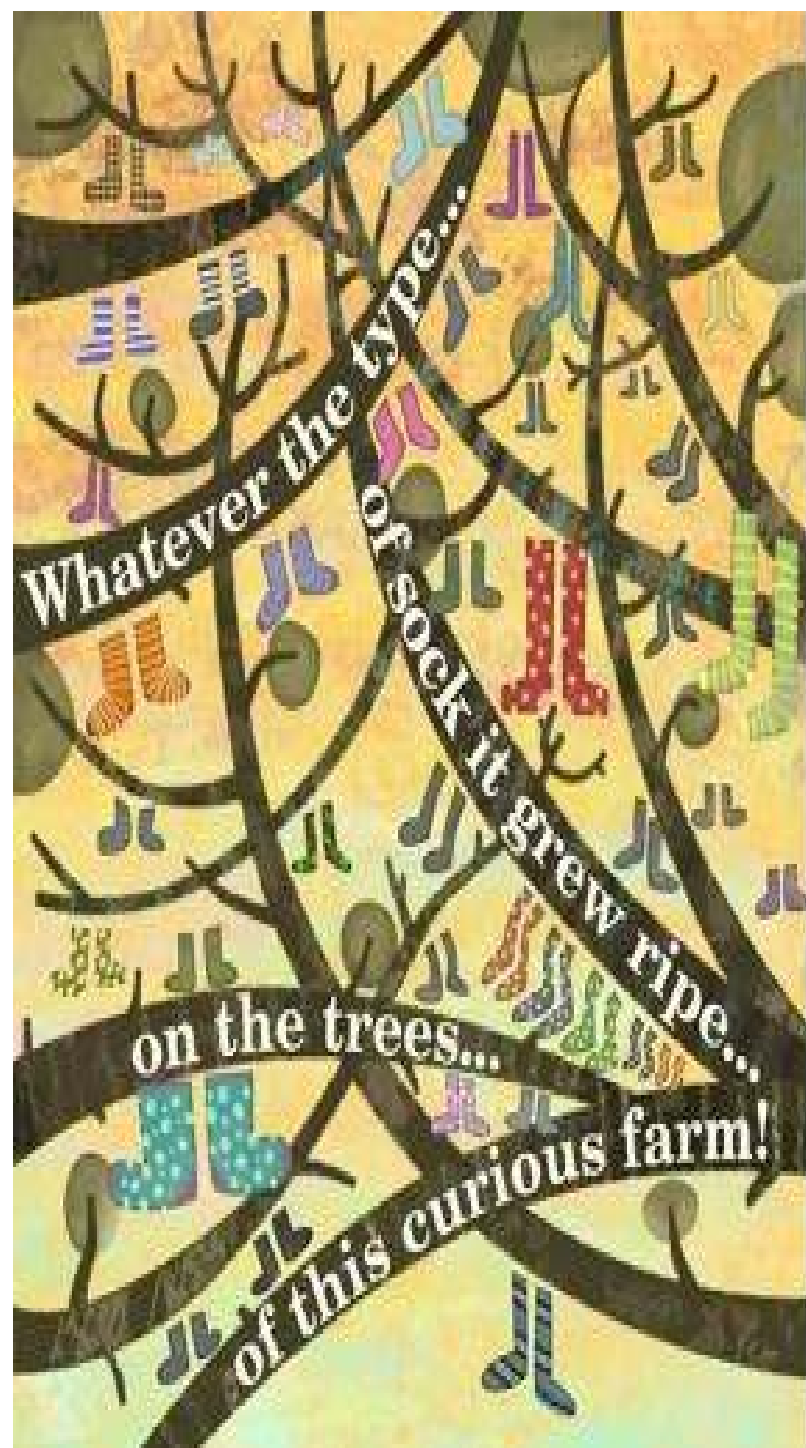
and spotty.

Chequered...

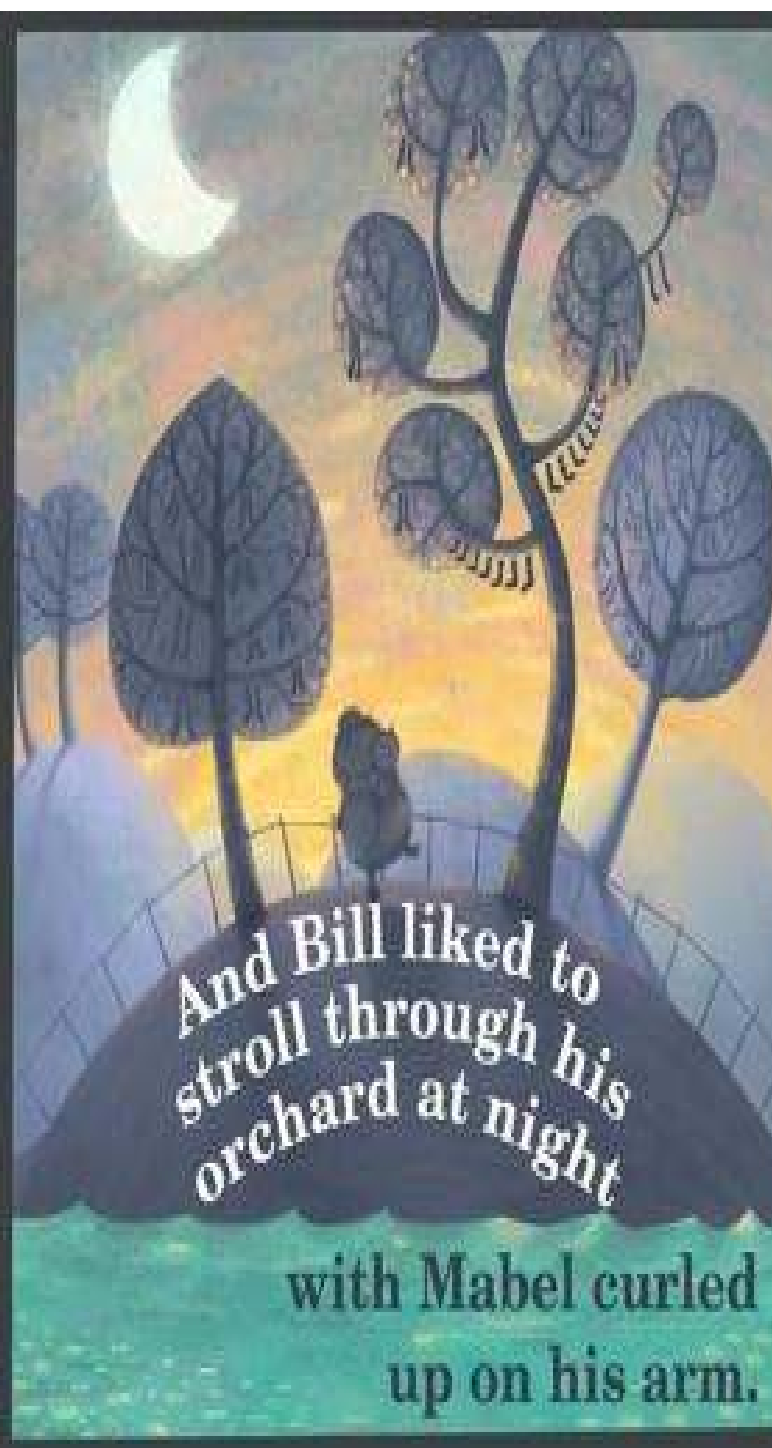
and

BUT!


It was **late**

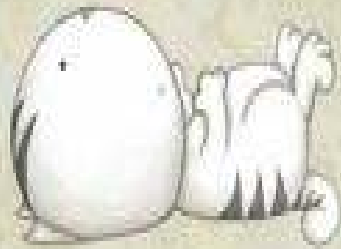

enough!”

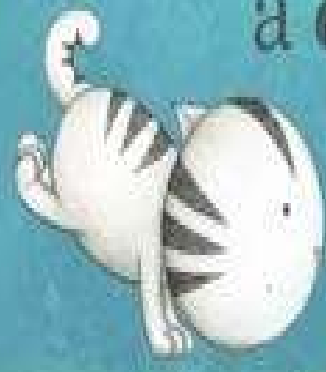




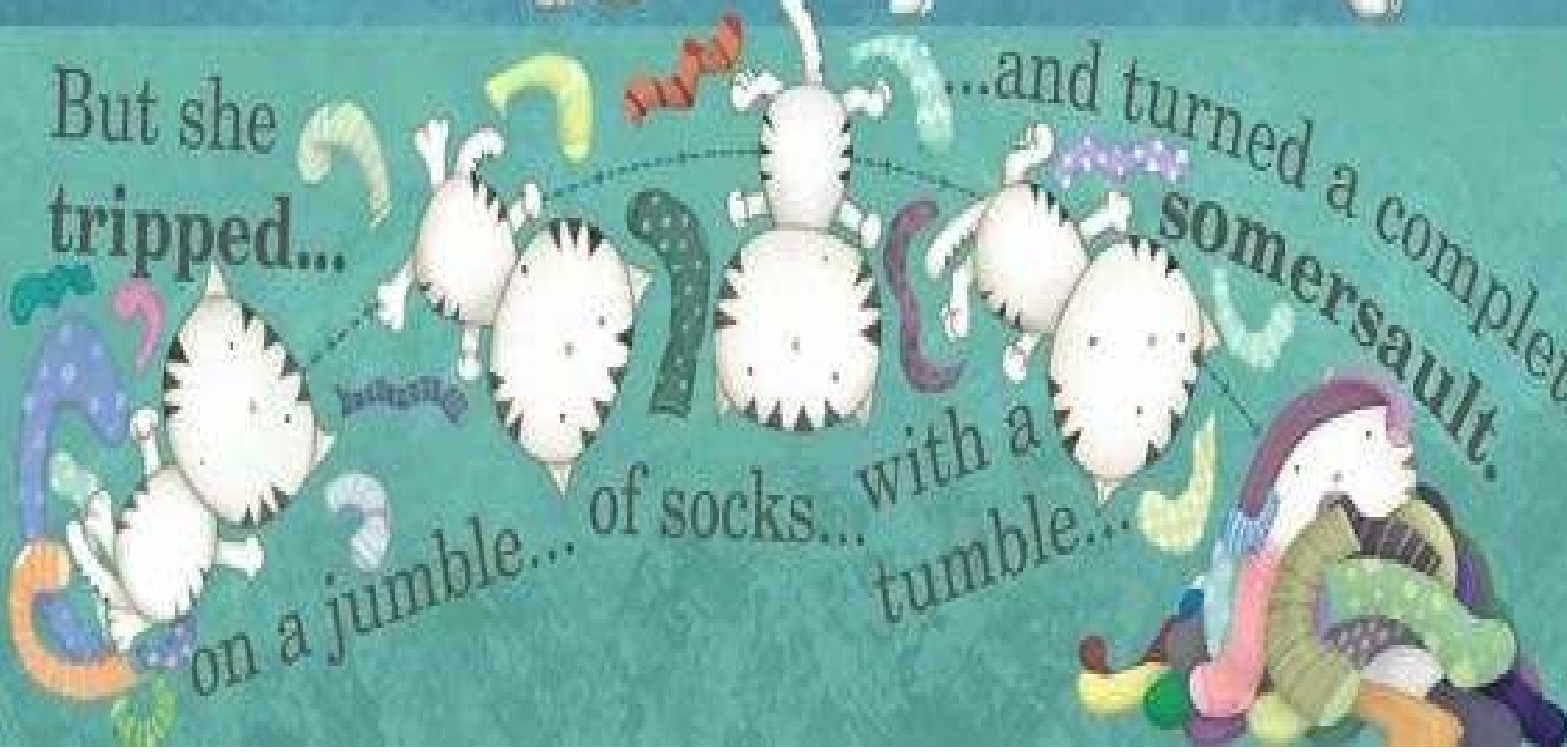
Quick as a **flash**,

tripped...

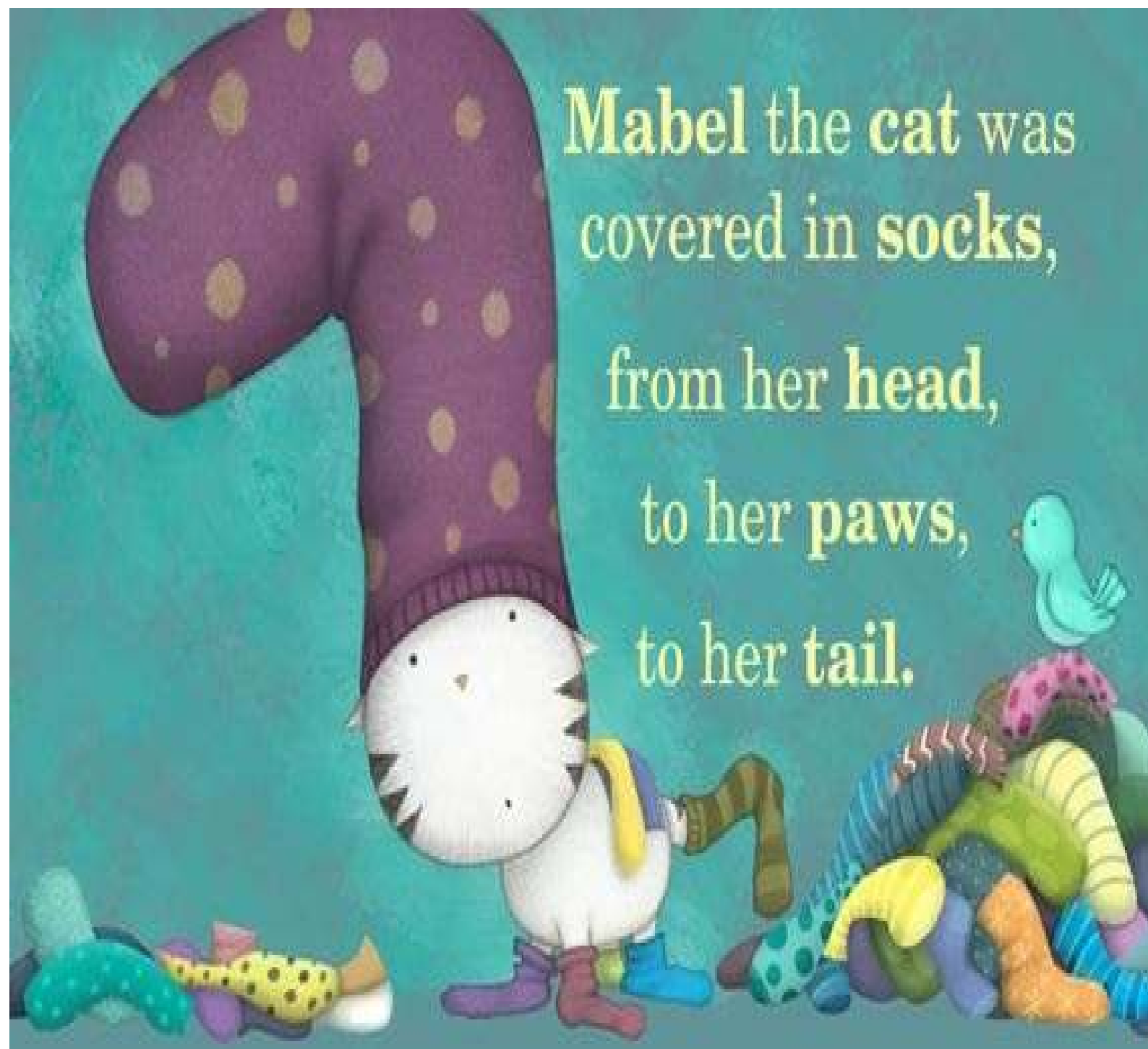


...and turned a complete

weird.”



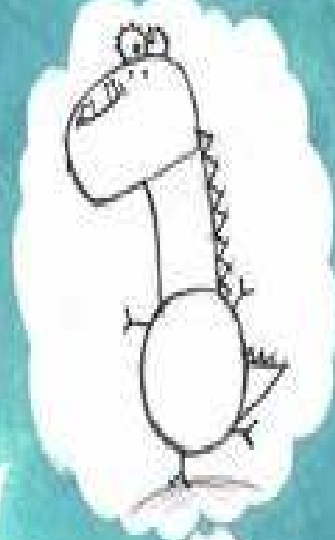
“It’s... A Sea Monster...

“Run!”

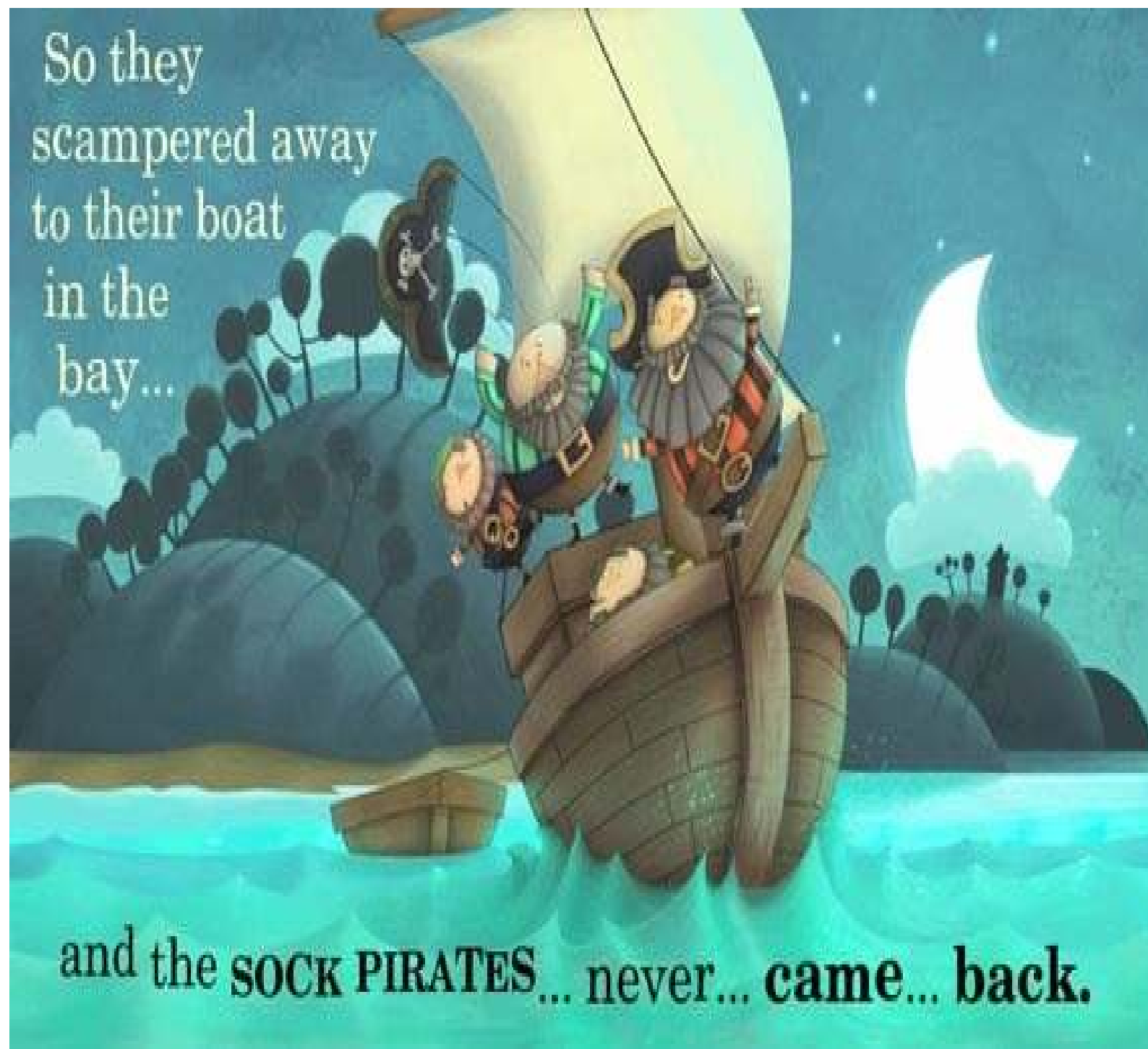
“Run!”
